

SIP trunking allows calls to be carried using VoIP technology rather than legacy fixed phone lines. This means that conventional PABX-based systems can leverage the flexibility and financial advantages of VoIP.

In the case where a SIP trunk replaces ISDN, the fixed costs of the connection are likely to be significantly lower (50% saving is likely).

Depending on the make and model of PABX, it may be possible to connect directly to the Internet router, if not a gateway device can be provided, as shown in the diagram below.

In addition to the financial benefits of SIP trunking, the VoIP solution also enable features such as central call queuing, business continuity options, call recording, and much more.
